When head football coach Chris Liner got the job, one of the first things he did was change the school colors back to the original shades.

"When I interviewed for this job, I asked, 'If I get it, can I bring back the old colors?' and they said yeah, so we did that immediately on the first day," Liner said.

Athletic to Director Mark Freeze, the school developed policy а this year to ensure that our colors are always the same shade for each sports team. "In our policy,

our colors are part of a Pantone Matching System, which matches colors so that they are always the

same... Our colors

are

(green)... There is no black, and there is no white, but those can be used as outlining colors," Freeze said.

Baseball coach and LDHS graduate Dale Nelson, '89, is excited about the school's finally coming to a unified school color for all sports.

"The

baseball uniforms never changed colors. We've always worn green and Athletic gold. About 10 years ago, other sports switched to the Vegas gold instead of the Athletic. I'm all about tradition, and I'm glad we're going back to the original school colors," Nelson said.

Western Civilization teacher and coach Liner's wife, Meredith Liner, was shocked when she found out that Laurens had ever changed from the original

> colors in the first place. "After I graduated in 1992, I hadn't been back to a high school football game here and I didn't know the colors changed until I saw highlights of a game on TV. I was shocked, because Laurens has always been green and gold," Liner said.
